Technology

Bring Your Own Laptop

Mission: St. Xavier encourages students to take responsibility for their growth and education in society by using technology to enhance, improve, engage, and stimulate the learning environment for students.



Types of Devices:

- *Laptop*: The traditional option, the laptop has a keyboard permanently attached to the screen and can come with touch screen capabilities.
- *2 in 1*: This device looks like a traditional laptop, however the keyboard is attached to the screen with hinges, allowing the screen to be removed (based on model) and rotated to fit the needs of the user. This picture shows the various ways that a 2 in 1 device can be used.
- *Tablet*: The tablet is a fully functioning computer that is sold without a keyboard. All of the necessary ports (USB, power, etc) are located on the side of the screen. Keyboards can be purchased separately to make this device feel more like a laptop. A good example of this is the Microsoft Surface Pro 4.

Basic Requirements

- Processor: Intel Core i5 minimum
- Memory: 8GB recommended
- Hard Drive: 128 GB or more
- Display type: Touchscreen LED (must work with a stylus)
- Wireless Networking: 802.11ac
- Operating System: Windows 10
- Ports: USB 3.0, Headphone, HDMI or Display Port
- Camera
- Microphone
- Physical keyboard (either attached or Bluetooth)
- Battery: 8 hours after a full charge

Creating a Partnership

- Help your son develop good habits with the device. Perhaps limit personal content on the device.
- Set parameters to only use the device in common areas of the home
- Check in on a regular basis to see how he is using the device
- Check in to see if your son understands how each teacher posts content online.
- Make sure your son knows and follows each teacher's classroom policy with the device
- Help them understand that this is a "*work device*"
- St Xavier will:
 - Assist your son to grow and develop proper study habits and digital citizenship skills.
 - Restrict our network at school to prohibit online gaming and inappropriate content
 - Send communications to parents and students about various technology issues including social media, proper usage and resources for help.
