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Our Community

St. Xavier High School, founded in 1831, is a Catholic college preparatory school for young men conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Students enrolled at St. Xavier reside in all areas of greater Cincinnati, including northern Kentucky and southeastern Indiana. The student body is approximately 80 percent Roman Catholic. The remaining 20 percent of students includes other Christian denominations and the Jewish, Hindu, Buddhist, and Islamic faiths.

GRADUATE AT GRADUATION

To guide every facet of curriculum development at St. Xavier, the faculty has produced this summary statement of the characteristics that the graduate will have acquired during his time at the school. ADMISSION

Admission to St. Xavier is selective based upon a qualifying examination and previous academic performance.

DIVERSITY

There is an 19.3% percent minority population in the school. More than 130 grade schools are represented within St. Xavier High School's student body. In addition, students attend St. Xavier from three different states.

FINANCIAL AID

49 percent of the students receive tuition assistance through St. Xavier's financial aid program. Last year students were awarded 4.6 million dollars in financial aid.

SIZE AND ACADEMIC RIGOR

All 1,440 young men at St. Xavier High School are enrolled in an authentic college preparatory program. Historically, 99 percent of graduates each year enter a four-year college or university program.

ACCREDITATION

St. Xavier High School is accredited by the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association, AdvancED, and the Ohio Department of Education.



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

23.5 units are required for graduation:

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Mathematics
- 4 units of Religious Education
- 3 units of Foreign Language (all in the same language)
- 3 units of Social Studies
- 3 units of Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- 1 unit of Fine Arts
- 1/2 unit of Physical Education
- 1/2 unit of Health
- 1/4 unit of Oral Communication
- 1/4 unit of Computer Science

- St. Xavier High School uses an unweighted 100 point scale. We also offer a 4.0 conversion. All classes are computed in the GPA.

- Even the most rigorous senior schedule would rarely include more than 3-4 AP courses.
